CenteringParenting

CenteringParenting brings 6-8 moms, partners or support person and their same-age babies together with their healthcare providers. The same families are together for each session. During each visit, there is (1) a parent support session facilitated by a Behavioral Health provider and a Pediatric or Family Medicine provider, and (2) the Pediatric or Family Medicine provider will do an examination, developmental assessment and order age-appropriate immunizations for the parent's baby.

These sessions take 2 hours. There are English and Spanish sessions. These sessions provide great satisfaction to the parents and providers!
